Dubai tenders Expo metro link design and build deal

Dubai's Roads & Transport Authority (RTA) has invited prequalified consortiums to bid by 6 December for the design-and-build of the new metro link connecting to the Dubai Expo 2020 site.

It is understood eight groups have been invited to bid, including:

- Mapa Gunal (Turkey)/China Railway Group (China)/CSR Corporation (China);
- Acciona (Spain)/Gulermak (Turkey)/Alstom (France);
- Obayashi (Japan)/Wade Adams (local)/Brookfield Multiplex (Canada)/Mitsubishi Heavy Industries (Japan);
- Orascom (Egypt)/Yapi Merkezi (Turkey)/GS Engineering & Construction (South Korea)/Siemens (Germany);
- Salini Impregilo (Italy)/Construcciones y Auxiliar de Ferrocarriles (Spain);
- Nurol (Turkey)/Astaldi (Italy)/Construcciones y Auxiliar de Ferrocarriles (Spain);
- Habtoor Leighton Group (local/Australia)/Deutsche Bahn (Germany)/Hochtief (Germany)/Hyundai Rotem (South Korea);
- Ssangyong Corporation (South Korea)/Construcciones y Auxiliar de Ferrocarriles (Spain).

A contract award is planned by the RTA for January 2016. The scheme, known as Route 2020, involves building a 15-kilometre rail network branching off the existing Red Line at the Nakheel Harbour & Tower station.

Dubai to tender rainwater drainage tunnel project

Dubai Municipality is planning to tender a AED4.5bn (\$1.2bn) tunnel scheme in the Jebel Ali area.

The rainwater and surface water drainage tunnel, which is still at the design stage, will run from Al-Maktoum International airport into the Gulf.

The scheme will be split into three packages. Two will be for tunnelling, and one for pumping stations. The largest package will involve a 25-kilometre-long section of tunnelling.

The municipality is expected to invite contractors to prequalify to bid for the deals by early September. Contract awards are planned for mid-2016.

The municipality is also planning to build a deep-sewer tunnel

and network in the Deira area of the emirate, similar to the Strategic Tunnel Enhancement Programme (STEP) under way in Abu Dhabi.

Plans for the project are still in the early stages, and details on the size and capacity of the tunnel and network have not been finalised.

MEED understands the municipality is set to tender a preliminary engineering contract for the project, which will involve providing about 30 per cent of the design.

According to sources close to the scheme, a consultant will be appointed for the initial design work late this year or in early 2016.

Dubai evaluates bids for power plant expansion

Project will expand captive power plant for aluminium producer

Dubai Aluminium (Dubal) is evaluating proposals for the contract to expand the capacity of its captive power generation facilities.

The aluminium producer received up to 14 prices from nine bidders, according to sources close to the project. The reason for more prices than bidders is due to several bidders submitting alternative bids using different technology options.

The scheme will expand the capacity of Dubal's captive power plant by 450-550MW.

In January, MEED reported that Dubal had raised a \$1.8bn seven-year syndicated corporate loan to help fund its investment plans.

Dubal is a wholly owned subsidiary of local company Emirates Global Aluminium.

Meanwhile, Emirates Aluminium (Emal), the Abu Dhabi-based operating subsidiary of Emirates Global Aluminium, is also undertaking a project to boost the capacity of its captive power plant which is located at its complex in Khalifa Industrial Zone Abu Dhabi (Kizad).

Emal initially received bids in February, but asked firms to submit fresh prices due to bids being too high. It is currently evaluating the resubmitted prices.

South Korea's Samsung C&T recently completed work on the \$625m second-phase expansion of the captive power plant at the Emal complex. The expansion of the power plant increased the capacity of the plant from 2,000MW to 3,100MW.

Samsung C&T was the contractor for the second-phase expansion, and the US' GE provided turbines for the project.

The second-phase expansion of the Emal smelter will boost its output by 550,000 tonnes a year (t/y) to 1.3 million t/y by mid-2014.
