Female contractors appeal for Govt support

LACK of support for women in the construction sector has become a hindrance for marketing local contractors to boost a lot of construction companies run by women in the country, says NASI industry CEO Namakau Siyanga.

Ms Siyanga said it was difficult for women in the industry to penetrate into the market because they lacked support.

She said the local contractors needed to be given a priority so that the country did not lose colossal sums of money to other countries.

Ms Siyanga said a lot of people especially women were scared of going into the construction sector because it was not well marketed in Zambia as they

(women) were underrated.

"People think construction is meant for men alone, but this is the sector where women with skills can do well and my appeal is for support to this sector so that more women could be encouraged to do work men can do," she said.

Ms Siyanga said the Government's continued commitment to empowering women through policies and directives should also extend to the construction sector so that a number of women were attracted. She said the construction jobs were given to international companies when the local ones were regarded as less experienced to be allocated local road tendering contracts.

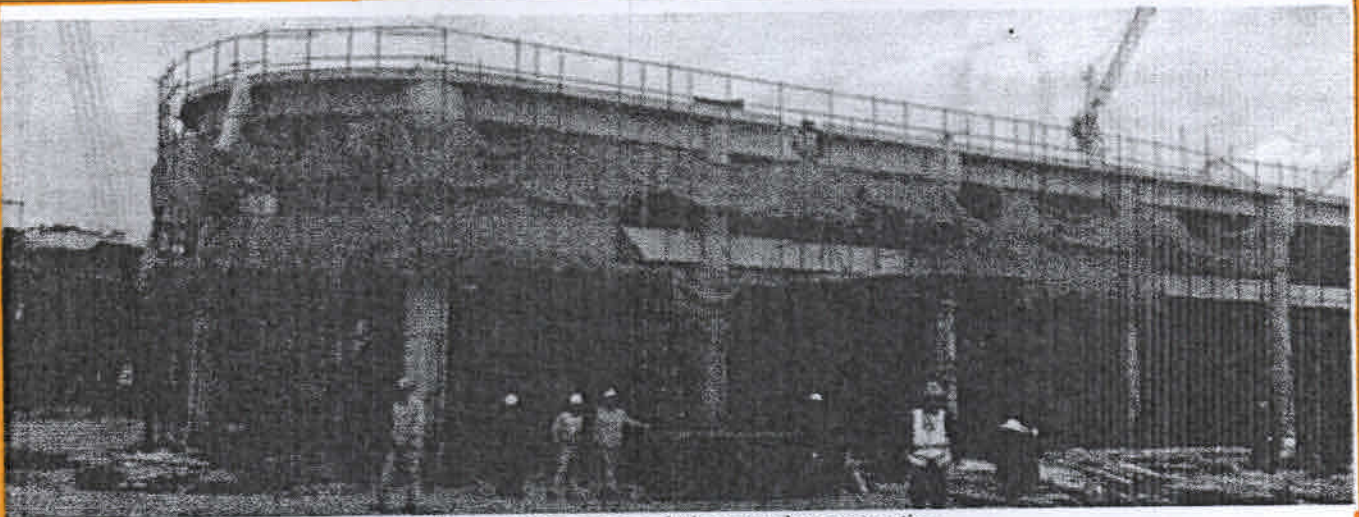
"We are proud women who can do wonders if we were given such opportunities. The relevant authori-

ties must show the faith and confidence in the local contractors through support for them to do a commendable job," she said.

She said awarding contracts to the locals would motivate women to participate in infrastructure development across the country, saying she was hopeful that the new Housing and Infrastructure Development ministry would reconsider to bridge the gaps and perceptions about awarding contracts to local contractors.

Ms Siyanga said women contractors had been tendering for various road works and buildings to be done but were not awarded.

She said women were anxious to work and contribute positively to the country's economy through various activities.

Construction of KKI Airport on course

ONLY 32 percent of the work at the new international terminal at Kenneth Kaunda International Airport which is being carried out at a cost of US\$360 million has been done, but the project is on course.

Responding to a press query, Zambia Airports Corporation Limited (ZACL) communication and brand manager Mweembe Sikaulu disclosed that the construction works at the new airport terminals were going on well.

Ms Sikaulu said that the scope of work being carried out at the new site included the construction of a K4 million capacity international terminal building with six aero bridges.

She added that the project would also include the construction of a thirty room capacity in-transit hotel as well as a seventy room non-transit passenger hotel.

Ms Sikaulu stated that the construction of the new Presidential Pavilion was also progressing well and that a new shopping centre and office complex were also set to be built near the airport.

"Works at KKIA, at a cost of US\$360 million is progressing well. The scope of work includes the construction of a K4 million capacity international terminal building with 6 aero bridges. There will also be construction of a 30 room capacity in-transit hotel as well as a seventy 70 room non-transit pas-

senger hotel. There will be construction of new taxi ways, aprons, rescue and fire services stations, landside and airside drive ways as well as an Air Traffic Control Tower. New Presidential Pavilion is also progressing well and a new shopping centre and office complex on set to be built near the airport," she said.

Ms Sikaulu also stated that so far there had been no major challenges experienced with regards to the project and that they were happy with the progress of the construction thus far.

She expressed confidence that the construction works at the new international terminal at Kenneth Kaunda International Airport would be completed by 2019. Ms Sikaulu further

said that part of the scope of work was the rehabilitation and refurbishment of the existing Kenneth Kaunda International airport which she said shall be turned into a 2 million passenger capacity domestic terminal once the newly constructed international terminal was complete.

"The terminal will house executive lounges, charters, low cost carriers, general aviation, cafés, restaurants, banks and other amenities.

We are appealing to the travelling public to bear with us through this process. However, once done Zambia Airports Corporation Limited shall deliver an upgraded terminal building with international standards that will rival others in the region" she said.

Father held as 3 girls defiled in Isoka

THREE girls have been defiled in three separate incidents in Isoka district of Muchinga Province, Police Commissioner Auxensio Daka has confirmed.

Mr. Daka disclosed that the crimes happened at the weekend.

He said the first defilement case was in Kalungu village and involved a father who defiled his 12-year-old daughter.

The commissioner said in the second case, a

42-year-old man named as Peter Simukoko defiled a juvenile of the same village over the weekend.

Mr. Daka said both victims sustained injuries and police have since arrested the two suspects.

"The suspects are in police custody and they are both of the same area. The victims sustained painful cuts on their private parts due to forced penetration," Mr. Daka said.

And in the third case, Mr. Daka disclosed that a 15-year-old girl was defiled by unknown people along Kasoka river in unclear circumstances.

The victim's sister Brenda Mwandila reported the

matter to police after discovering that her sister was in a state of confusion after she was defiled.

Mr. Daka said police had not made any arrest in the case which occurred on Sunday at about 13:30 hours.

"The matter was immediately reported to the police after the incident occurred; the victim's sister was the one who reported the matter upon discovering something unusual about the victim's behaviour," he said.

He said police have since launched a manhunt for the defilers.

back President Lungu so that the opposition leaders could be arrested and jailed.

"We are not voodoo men, so how are we going to kill President Lungu? We have no capacity to kill him because they are the ones that are controlling the State apparatus," Mr. Hichilema said.

He claimed the PF was setting up a scheme to attack President Lungu and frame him (Hichilema) and the UPND leadership of attempting to kill the President as part of a plot to destroy the opposition.

Mr. Hichilema claimed that more than 5,900 UPND sympathisers and members had been arrested and were incarcerated in

Meanwhile, Mr. Hichilema claimed that Speaker of the National Assembly Dr Matibini failed to show leadership in the House by siding with parliamentarians from Government.

He said he would not be threatened with being cited for contempt of Parliament, stating that members of the opposition were always curtailed by Dr. Matibini when debating in the House.

"The Speaker will never curtail members of PF debating wrongly in the House, but he will always curtail the UPND members even before they open their mouths," Mr. Hichilema said.

Govt to focus on roads with economic value - Chitotela

GOVERNMENT has announced that it will concentrate on the construction of the road with economic value in its continued programme of infrastructure development.

Works and Supply Minister Ronald Chitotela said the ambitious infrastructure development the Patriotic Front (PF) government embarked on when it took over the governance of the coun-

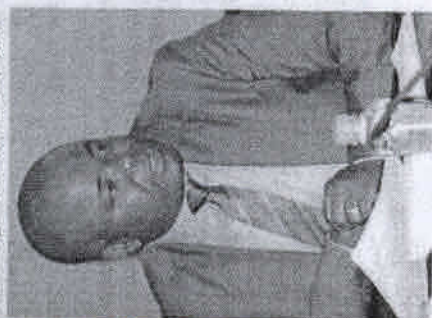
try in 2011 was going to continue but that attention would be focused on road network with economic gains to the treasury.

And Mr Chitotela has said Zambia was in dire need of modern infrastructure in both the energy, agriculture as well as in the housing sectors.

Mr Chitotela, however, said while Government was going to focus on infrastructure with economic gains, it did not mean that social roads in communities and rural areas were going to be abandoned.

He said Government would continue budgeting for the Link Zambia 8000 road project which was initially estimated to cost US\$5.46 billion and other road projects such as the L400 would be considered on the basis of the availability of resources.

"The construction of the road network will continue because the sector is a catalyst to the country's economic development. President Edgar Lungu's vision is infrastructure development as we work towards industrialisation. The agriculture sector depends on good road in-

Mr Chilufya 25, has thanked President Lungu for recognising the leadership of young people.

The President has appointed a fifteen-member Commission of Inquiry to examine the electoral violence in the August 11, general elections including Mr Chilufya, the youngest member, a move that has elated youths in Zambia. Mr Chilufya assured the nation that he was equal to the task and would give his utmost in ensuring that the final report was comprehensive.

"I am very humbled by the appointment. It really shows that the President believes in young people. It's really a huge task, but I will do the work professionally and also prove a point that young people can contribute to the development of the country," Mr Chilufya said.

And youths have applauded President Lungu for appointing Mr. Chilufya as a member of the Commission of Inquiry.

Former University of Zambia Students Union (UNZASU) president Jones Mwewa said the appointment of Mr. Chilufya reaffirmed President Lungu's commitment to appoint Youths in leadership and decision-making positions.

"We are confident that Mr Chilufya, who is also a University of Zambia recent graduate, will make us proud, especially that he served as a National Youth Coordinator for Pillars of Peace (Zambia)," Mr Mwewa said.

And Former Evelyn Hone College Students Union (EHCOSU) president Madalitso Mvula described the appointment of Mr. Chilufya as a welcome move.

St Mary's Sec School parents protest mall construction

It does not matter who the owners of the land are, what is important is that we do not want the Shopping Mall to be constructed near St Mary's Secondary School, a Concerned Parent has said.

Reacting to a statement by the Zambia Conference of Catholic Bishops (ZCCB) that the land earmarked for development of a mall does not belong to the school, parents of pupils at St Mary's Secondary School in Lusaka said they would not allow the construction of the shopping mall near the school premises because it would disturb their girls' education.

This follows talks between ZCCB, who are the owners of the land and a South African company who have agreed to construct a shopping mall on a piece of land next to the school premises.

Mr Sinda disclosed in an interview that it did not matter who the owners of the land were but that the project should be halted.

He disclosed that ZCCB was planning to rent out part of its land to a South African company because it had financial problems.

Mr Sinda, however, said prior-

ity should be given to the pupils so that they were able to learn in an environment that did not disturb their academic programmes.

"It does not matter who the owners of the land are. What is important is that we do not want that project. Priority should first be given to the pupils," he said.

Another parent who spoke on condition of anonymity said that the land in question was within the school grounds and that ZCCB should find another piece of land for the proposed shopping mall.

Ms Agatha Muyunda, another concerned parent, explained that her fears were that the girls would be prone to harassment by male workers and taxi drivers at the mall.

And St Mary's Secondary School Parents Teachers' Association (PTA) chairperson said that she could not comment on the matter because it was still under discussion.

But according to ZCCB secretary general Cleophas Lungu, the land where the school was situated belonged to the Archdiocese of Lusaka, and it was there that the construction of the mall had been proposed.

\$6bn Kasama-Lubumbashi railway line in offing

A GROUP of Zambians is set to present to the ministry of Transport and Communications, a technical and financial proposal on establishment of a US\$6 billion railway line from Kasama to Lubumbashi in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).

Project promoter Wisdom Gondwe said the railway project called Luano Railway started last year and a technical report was going to be presented to the ministry of Transport soon.

Mr Gondwe said Luano Railway is a 460 kilometre line that would start in Kasama, go

is a good project that is aimed at opening up Luapula and Northern provinces to business opportunities," Mr Gondwe said.

He said the railway line would shorten the distance of transporting goods from Zambia to the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), the Great Lakes Region and the Southern African Development Community.

Mr Gondwe said the project had received goodwill from the Government, COMESA and investors from Spain, Italy and the Middle East.

He said in a few weeks, Luano Railway

would sign mutual agreements with partners.

Mr Gondwe said the railway line would ease the pressure on the roads and was in line with the Patriotic Front (PF) manifesto to connect Zambia with railway infrastructure.

The project would also encompass the construction of houses, hospitals and schools along the districts through which the railway line would pass.

Mr Gondwe said the project should be supported because it had multiple benefits for the investors, Government and communities along the Luano Railway project.
