

Chapter 1: Status on Safety and Security

[Raising public awareness concerning safety and security] — Over 70% of Japanese citizens perceive Japan today as dangerous In December 2005, MLIT administered a survey on the perceptions of Japanese citizens. Over 70% of those surveyed said that they think Japan today "is dangerous" or "is on the dangerous side," frequently claiming this perception was "due to unforeseen incidence of natural disasters, accidents, and terrorism" among other problems.

The Safety of Japan Today against Natural Disasters, Accidents, and Terrorism






n = 92.8


