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44 -Hidatakayama - (Takayama, Gifu)

A tourist destination where travelers can experience historical streets, festivals, and elements of Japanese tradition and culture that are as alive as they were in their heyday, as well as the majesty of nature.

Highlights



Historical streets

Rows of elegant old houses that have retained their connections to the Edo period from four centuries ago remain. Shops housed in town houses (old private residences) line the streets, rickshaws are drawn through town, and visitors take delight in strolling through bustling neighborhoods.



Hida-no-Sato (Hida Folk Village)

Over thirty distinctive private residential structures, including gassho-style houses (traditional Japanese homes built with steeply pitched thatched roofs), were relocated from areas around Takayama and reconstructed at this site in an effort to recreate the lives of the local people as they were once led. Demonstrations of various traditional craftworks are also conducted for the benefit of visitors.



Shinhotaka Ropeway

The Shinhotaka Ropeway is the largest of its kind in the East. After riding a gondola at a height of 2,200 meters above sea level, disembark at the top to enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view from an observatory situated at Nishihodaka Station.
