Sustainable Development in the Canadian Federal Context

- From 1995 to June 2008, the Auditor General Act required Ministers to table departmental Sustainable Development Strategies every three years
- Transport Canada, along with other federal department, tabled strategies in 1997, 2000, 2003 and 2006
- Passage of the new Federal Sustainable
 Development Act changes the accountabilities,
 process and associated timelines



Transport Canada's 2007-2009 Sustainable Development Strategy

- Tabled in Parliament in December 2006 (4th SDS)
- Takes a long-term approach that includes focused, results-oriented commitments in areas that Transport Canada can make a difference
- Focused on three topics at the heart of sustainable transportation: urban; commercial freight; and marine transportation
- Transport Canada's Strategy is viewed positively by stakeholders and the Commissioner for the Environment and Sustainable Development (CESD)



Seven Strategic Challenges

- 1. Encourage Canadians to make more sustainable transportation choices
- 2. Enhance innovation and skills development
- 3. Increase system efficiency and optimize modal choices
- 4. Enhance efficiency of vehicles, fuels and fuelling infrastructure
- 5. Improve performance of carriers and operators
- 6. Improve decision-making by governments and the transportation sector
- 7. Improve management of Transport Canada operations and lands



The Federal Sustainable Development Act (FSDA)

- New Federal Sustainable Development Act (June 2008) changes accountabilities, process and associated timelines
- Policy objectives of the Act:
 - Development of an overarching federal sustainable development strategy (with supporting departmental strategies) that provides a longer-term vision for the future; and
 - An accountability mechanism, allowing citizens and Parliament to evaluate federal government progress on longer-term sustainable development objectives



New Approach: The Federal Sustainable Development Act (FSDA) (cont'd)

- The Minister of the Environment is currently developing an overarching Federal Sustainable Development Strategy, to be tabled in the House by Spring/Summer of 2010
- Individual Ministers are responsible for their departmental Sustainable Development Strategies that must contribute to/comply with the federal strategy.
