#### **Aeronautical Consultations between Japan and Austria**

The consultations between the aeronautical authorities of Japan and Austria were held in Vienna, Austria, on 18, 19 and 20 February 2014. The outline of the meeting is as follows:

### 1. Delegations

From the Japanese side, Mr. Taro Kobayashi, Director of the Air Talks Office, Civil Aviation Bureau, Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism (Head of Delegation), and other representatives attended the meeting.

From the Austrian side, Mr. Anton Kozusnik, Director, Department for Environment, Transport and Telecommunication, Federal Ministry for European and International Affairs (Head of Delegation), and other representatives attended the meeting.

## 2. Summary of the Outcome

- I. Full-Fledged Open Skies Agreement
  - (1) Narita Airport
    Liberalization of air services between Japan and Austria.
  - (2) Airports outside the Tokyo metropolitan area Liberalization of air services between Japan and Austria, and beyond.
- II. At Haneda Airport, the new agreement allows both Japanese and Austrian airlines to operate one (1) round-trip flight per day during the late night and early morning hours.
- III. Full liberalization of a framework for code-sharing with the objective of increasing operational flexibility for both Japanese and Austrian airlines.
  - \* Japan has concluded Open Skies agreements with 27 countries/regions thus far.
