Kairakuen is counted as one of Japan's three greatest gardens, alongside Kenrokuen in Kanazawa and Korakuen in Okayama. It was first opened in 1842 by Tokugawa Nariaki, the 9th lord of the Mito Clan, as a place for local citizens to relax and enjoy themselves. During the Ume Matsuri (Plum Blossom Festival) in late February to early March, more than 3000 plum trees of 100 different varieties bloom, filling the garden with a floral fragrance.

Home to approximately 580 species, Aqua World Oarai boasts one of the most diverse aquatic exhibitions in all Japan, and is widely recognized as housing the largest number of shark species in the country. In the last few years the aquarium has seen exciting new additions thanks to its "Come on, Shinsekai!" initiative, including a mystical area with jellyfish of all shapes and sizes, and a musical performance where over 15,000 iwashi sardines swirl under changing lights! Aqua World is also invested in the discovery and research of new species of jellyfish, and is the first center in Japan (fifth world-wide) to successfully breed sand tiger sharks.
