

Niyodo River





124 kilometers long, the Niyodo River is the third largest in Shikoku after the Shimanto River and the Yoshino River. It originates from Mt. Ishizuchi in Ehime. In 2011 and 2012, it ranked top in water quality among class 1 rivers in Japan, and it's called a miraculous clear stream. In the Niyodo River basin you will find beautiful ravines like the Yasui and Nakatsu ravines as well as facilities where you can take classes on how to make Tosawashi Japanese paper.
