Think Together about the Capital Functions Relocation of Japan

Panel for Studying How the Capital Function City Should Utilize IT

The National Land Agency established the "Panel for Studying How the Capital Function City Utilize Information Technology (IT)." The Panel consists of ten experts in areas such as information and urban planning. The chairman is by Dr. Hideo Aiso, Dean of the Tokyo University of Technology and the Vice-chairman is Mr. Jitsuro Terashima of Mitsui Global Strategic Studies Institute. The Panel held its first meeting on September 11. In addition, the Agency will conduct a large-scale survey covering local public bodies and private enterprises as part of the panel study.

Details of Study

A Rough Sketch of Highly Electro-Networked Capital Function City

- An international, electronicized political and administrative city with goals of improving policy planning functions, upgrading the effectiveness of the administrative systems, and assuring the functions of an international political city
- An epoch-making, electronicized disaster prevention city seeking to establish measures for safe and reliable networks to fully demonstrate a control-tower function even in cases of a large-scale disasters
- An IT-networked model city trying to mitigate and solve current urban and community problems

Re-sorting the Significance and Effects of Capital Functions Relocation in the Era of Advanced Information Networks

- Reform of overall national politics by coordination between capital functions relocation and IT networking
- Capital functions relocation and correction of monopolar concentration of information
- Augmentation of capability to respond to electronic information disasters through capital functions relocation

The results of the study will not only be utilized for the future studying of the capital functions relocation but will also be released to the public after being summarized.

Capital Functions Relocation Pavilion Displayed at the Internet Exhibition

The National Land Agency will display the Capital Functions Relocation Pavilion at the Internet Exhibition (Inpaku) which will be held from December 31, 2000, to allow more people to deepen their understanding of the capital functions relocation while amusing themselves and to encourage them to further consider this issue. The main projects (draft) of the Inpaku are introduced below.

[Project (Draft)] 1. Construction of a Virtual Capital Function City ~ Let's Construct the Capital Function City Together! ~

This is the biggest project to date focused on bidirectionality characterized by utilizing the Internet, the most dominant theme of the Inpaku, and will be implemented over a year as the main project of the Pavilion.



Example: Diet Square

When the Inpaku starts, the capital function city in the Pavilion displaying the new city, the destination of the capital functions relocation, originates in the Pavilion (by summarizing the Capital Function City Experiencing CD-ROM).

A scene (Diet Square, Embassy District, and others) is extracted from the virtual capital function city. Your opinions about the image are solicited on the Internet for a given period (about two weeks)

Four to five images will be produced by the Secretariat to reflect opinions of the applicants.

The images produced will be introduced in the Pavilion.

Examples of Opinions about the Diet Square Plaza with more greenery is desired.

Plaza where people gather naturally and get relaxed is desired.

Second Place 1,572 Votes Image No. 1 "Diet Square with Full of Greenery" Popularity voting is conducted for a given period (about two weeks) on the Internet, and the most popular image will be built into the virtual capital function city in the Pavilion.

The above procedures will be reiterated for about ten images over a year to change the images of the capital function city based on people's opinions.

First Opinion Invitation: From December 31, 2000 to January 15, 2001 Popularity Voting: From January 22 to January 29, 2001 Second Opinion Invitation: From January 29 to February 13, 2001 Popularity Voting: From February 19 to February 26, 2001

The virtual capital function city reflecting public opinion will be completed in the pavilion in November 2001 or later.

2. Inpaku Capital Function City Image Contest

We would like people to freely depict images of the city either by Computer Graphics (CG) or sketches without reference to the various imagery drawings of the city, the destination of the capital functions relocation, drawn in the past. We will then collect them for introduction into the Pavilion, when popularity voting will be held on the Internet. Applications are invited in two sections, the primary and junior high school student section and the general section.



Period of the Invitation: From November 1, 2000 to October 31, 2001

Period of Popularity Voting: From December 31, 2000 to November 30, 2001

In the primary school and junior high school student section, the applicants should be elementary school or junior high school students as of the date of application.

In the general section, a brief explanation of 250 words or less should be attached to the images because innovative ideas are expected in the concepts as well as in the images themselves. Images can be submitted via CG or the Internet.

3. Invitation for the Pavilion Guide Character Design



An Example of Application: "Itenshi-kun" (By a female in Tokyo Metropolis)

We plan to have an amiable virtual character that can effectively act as a guide to the Pavilion come on stage in the image. To open the Pavilion, characters (still images by CG or sketch) will first be solicited on the Internet, and the winning character will be decided by popularity voting. The character selected will explains the ideas of the Pavilion and support the image operations using animation.

Period of Invitation: From November 1, 2000 to January 31, 2001 Period of Voting: From February 1, 2000 to February 28, 2001

4. Capital Function City Image Puzzle

The public is requested to complete the capital function city image by assembling individual pieces, and compete with other competitors.

5. Summary of the Capital Functions Relocation Introduced

The Pavilion guide character will introduce details, questions and answers about the capital functions relocation as well as reports of the Council for Relocation of the Diet and Other Organizations.

6 . Urban Planning, Architectural Concepts, and Landscapes of Various Countries Introduced Urban planning and landscapes of foreign capitals are introduced

7. Opinion Exchange Space 2001-Version

Opinion can be exchanged about the capital functions relocation and the Pavilion are conducted.

What is Inpaku? (http://www.inpaku.go.jp/)

The Internet Exhibition (Inpaku) is a memorial event held for a year from December 31, 2000 and defining the year of 2001 as the "Year Starting a New Millennium."

We would like all the people throughout Japan and foreign countries to participate in Inpaku so that people related to national and local public organizations, enterprises, nonprofit organizations, and international organizations may develop events on various themes utilizing the Internet. Inpaku is, so to speak, an event in which the pavilion for an exhibition is laid out on the Internet.
