The Inter-party Conference Committee of Both Houses on the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations

The seventh meeting of the Inter-party Conference Committee of Both Houses on the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations was held on Friday, May 28, 2004.

Committee members expressed their opinions freely as in the last meeting. They discussed the committee's agenda of "Method for seeking the Diet's decision", particularly the method for seeking the Diet's decision on the following points:

- 1. Whether the Diet would agree or disagree with the relocation
- 2. How the site should be decided from among the candidate sites

The Committee agreed that they should continue the discussion, and the Chairperson and the Vice-chairperson would discuss and decide how and where they could conclude this discussion.

A video, Development of an Environment and Energy Conscious New City, is now available on the Internet

The MLIT made a video, "Welcome to the New City! - Development of an Environment and Energy Conscious New City", which introduces an environment and energy conscious new city. The video includes animation films showing life in the city, introduction of overseas examples, and an interview with Midori Miyazaki of the Chiba University of Commerce.

As the Report of the Council on the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations (December 1999) and other such reports point out, it is hoped that the new city will be a model city for the world in terms of environmental consciousness. The new city must exist symbiotically with the environment, by bringing in knowledge and technologies and preserving the present environment of the site. The city must also make positive efforts to create new natural environment.

We hope the video arouses broad discussion among people on the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations and the image of an environment and energy conscious city.

Recent Major Activities Related to the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations in Each Region

- The eight Prefectural Governors of the three candidate sites presented a request to the members of the Inter-party Conference Committee of Both Houses on the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations on June 16. The request states, "We strongly request the Inter-Party Conference Committee members return to the initial intent of the Resolution on the Relocation of the Diet and Other Organizations (1990) and the Act for the Relocation of the Diet and Other Organizations (1992), recognize the responsibility of the Diet, and respect the Interim Reports of the Special Committees of both Houses which strongly urge implementing the relocation. We also request the members make concrete proposals for immediately implementing the relocation.
- The three candidate sites jointly made a poster with the slogan, "Japan's security, vitality, and structural reforms start with capital function relocation." An advertising campaign using the poster will be carried out in major JR stations throughout Japan.
- On April 26, the Fukushima Prefectural Government held the "Fukushima Congress for Capital Function Relocation in 2004" in Fukushima City.
- On May 18, the Gifu Aichi Council for Promoting Capital Function Relocation held their Annual General Meeting and Lecture Meeting for Capital Function Relocation in Nagoya City. In the lecture meeting, writer Shuzo Taki presented a lecture, "Capital function relocations in history".
- On May 27, the Gifu Tono Convention for Inviting Capital Functions held their Annual General Meeting and Lecture Meeting in Nakatsugawa City. In the lecture meeting, Professor Tatsuo Ito, the President of Nagoya Sangyo University, presented a lecture, "How the capital function relocation should be advanced."
