## **Trends in the Diet**

## The Inter-party Conference Committee of Both Houses on the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations

On Wednesday, May 18, the 13th Meeting of the Inter-party Conference Committee of Both Houses on the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations was held.

In this meeting, members exchanged their opinions concerning the Chairpersons' Report that was presented at the meeting in December, 2004. In the Report, it was proposed that relocating the core functions of crisis management should be prioritized.

At the end of the meeting, the Chairpersons expressed their opinions as follows:

- (1) Since relocating the core functions of crisis management is an important issue that requires urgent consideration, the Committee would like to discuss it energetically.
- (2) In the next meeting, the Committee would like to sort out the issues, and discuss those such as what are the core functions of crisis management, whether only the three candidate sites should be considered, or if other areas should also be considered.
- (3) The Committee would like to proceed with discussion so that the National Diet can include the research expenses for relocating the core functions of crisis management in the next fiscal budget.

## Recent moves concerning construction the new administrative capital in Korea

In South Korea, responding to the Constitutional Court's decision ruling the Special Act for the new Administrative Capital construction unconstitutional, follow-up measures had been examined.

On March 2, "the Special Act for the Construction of the Administrative Complex City in the Yeongi-Gongju Region as the Follow-up Measures concerning the New Administrative Capital" was passed. The Special Act will relocate sixteen government agencies including the Ministry of Construction & Transportation and the Ministry of Finance & Economy to the Yeongi-Gongju region in Chungcheongnam-do. The Office of the President, the Parliament, and the Supreme Court will stay in Seoul as well as some other government agencies.

According to the Special Act, a Promotion Committee for the Construction of the Administrative Complex City, which will be co-chaired by the Prime Minister and a person selected from private sector, will be established in order to discuss major issues concerning the construction of the Administrative Complex City. Also, the Administrative Complex City Construction Office will be established by January 1, 2006 under the Ministry of Construction & Transportation to encourage efficient construction of the City. The relocation is scheduled to be completed by 2012, after the establishment of a development plan, acquisition of the land, and construction.

Agencies to be relocated include the Ministry of Construction & Transportation, Ministry of Finance & Economy, Ministry of Education and Human Resources Development, Ministry of Culture & Tourism, Ministry of Science & Technology, Ministry of Agriculture & Forestry, Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Energy, Ministry of Information & Communication, Ministry of Health & Welfare, Ministry of Environment, Ministry of Labor, and Ministry of Maritime Affairs & Fisheries.

Agencies to stay in Seoul include the Ministry of Unification, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, Ministry of National Defense, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Government Administration and Home Affairs, and Ministry of Gender Equality.

## **Professor Osamu Koide (Professor at Tokyo University)**

Born in 1949. After teaching and studying at Tokyo University as an assistant professor and at MIT as a visiting researcher, became a professor at Tokyo University in 1990.

Also served as the chairperson of the Hokkaldo Prefectural Committee for Policy Evaluation, chairperson of the Chiba Prefectural Committee for PFI Project Reviewing, chairperson of the Iwate Prefectural Committee for Administrative and Financial Reform, senior counselor of the Cabinet's Reform Promotion Council on Special Corporations, and a member of the Liaison Council for Postal Service Privatization.



# Recent Major Activities Related to Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations in Each Region

- From February 1 to March 31, the Mie-Kio Region Liaison Council for Capital Function Relocation and Gifu-Aichi Council for Promoting Capital Function Relocation carried out a capital function relocation advertising campaign in the Tokaido and Sanyo shinkansen trains. The campaign was designed to target Diet members and opinion leaders. (A backlit advertisement titled "Ninja art of relocating capital functions" with Ninja characters was posted in first-class cars, and advertisements were placed on the wet towels and Hitotoki magazine given out in first-class cars.)
- The Tochigi Prefectural Residents' Meeting for the Relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations had a promotion corner at Tochigi Flower Festa 2005 in Oyama, which was held in Tochigi Prefectural Kennan Gymnastic Hall from February 18 to 20. Panels were exhibited, and pamphlets were distributed.
- On March 4, a lecture meeting to think about the relocation of the National Diet and Related Organizations was held in the Flower Festa Memorial Park in Seta, Kani City, Gifu Prefecture. Shogo Kariyazaki, flower arrangement artist, delivered a lecture titled "Flowers are a vitamin for your mind. Capital function relocation is a vitamin for Japan."
