# OVERVIEW

Primary Objectives of the Office of Community Planning and Development:

- Collaborates with Formula and Competitive Grantees;
- Provides training , technical assistance, overall management, monitoring, and oversight; and
- Processes and executes grant agreements to make annual and /or competitive funding awards available to grantees.

# Formula Funding 2023

Funding awards made to the City of New Orleans to develop viable urban communities by providing decent, safe, and sanitary housing and a suitable living environment, and by expanding economic opportunities, principally for low and moderate income persons by program type include:

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG): \$12,881,337

Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME): \$2,727,608

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG): \$1,128,749

Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA): \$3,918,651

# Competitive Funding 2023

Non-profits organizations, the City of New Orleans, and Continuum of Care (CoC) Grantees are awarded annual funding through a competitive process to address homelessness by providing access to transitional housing, supportive services, and permanent supportive housing to eligible participants. Funding for FY 23 includes:

CoC: \$32,898,648

The City of New Orleans is the recipient of several funding streams designed to address the negative impact of COVID-19, to reduce homelessness, and to target the unsheltered homeless population and increase housing stability including:

FY20 HOPWA CARES Act: \$558,821

FY20 HOPWA-C CARES Act: \$88,832

FY 21 HOME-ARP : \$9,474,585

FY 22 UNSHELTERED HOMELESS: \$10,951,740
