How to integrate non-conputerised parts in computerised SCM?

What role strategic alliances would play in structuring SCM?

What new challenges SCM must tackle with and how?

Questions Concerning Optimising China-related SCM

Ex. What are current situations of SCM in China-related logistics?

What factors influence SCM structuring in China?

What are major challenges for China-related SCM?

How to tackle with these challenges?

3. Expected Implications for APEC ITF

The discussions on SCM supporting logistics are not limited to Chinarelated services, but are essentially applicable to those concerning other countries.

The results obtained from the Symposium will support APEC ITF in enhancing the discussions on logistics services using inter-modal transportation.

Japan's MLIT has a strong interest, which JIFFA supports, in grading up the discussions developed in the Symposium to APEC ITF level by making a project proposal in the near future.

Conclusion

1: Japan/China Symposium on Logistics, organised by JIFFA and supported by Japan's MLIT, will largely contribute to China-related logistics, including those using inter-modal transportation.

2: The symposium's arguments will give considerable implications for APEC ITF discussions. Together with Japan's MLIT, JIFFA will report the results of the symposium to APEC ITF, in order to contribute to the ITF discussions.
