

Onoya Ryokan, Former Hotel

Only a handful of buildings both remain from the time when the *omotesando* approach to Naritasan Shinshoji Temple began to flourish in the Edo period (1603–1867) and also subsequently survived the two World Wars. The split-level Onoya Ryokan did. Built in 1935, this soaring and spacious wooden structure is located near Shinshoji Temple's Yakushido and is now a nationally registered Tangible Cultural Property. It no longer hosts overnight guests as an inn, but still operates as a restaurant where Japanese cuisine and delicacies such as eel can be enjoyed.
