The Hachiman Festival

Markings resembling a pair of slashes inside a ring can be often seen in the village, generally on the walls of homes and on boats. The symbol is made up of the character for the number eight, or hachi (written Λ), surrounded by a circle, and takes its name from Hachiman, the deity worshipped by the island's fishing communities. It is believed to protect residents from danger at sea and ensure a good harvest. The marks are re-applied in the same spots every January during the island's annual Hachiman Festival.
